NRS 383.121 Intergovernmental Cooperation

In accord with NRS 383.121, "all departments, commissions, boards and other agencies of the State and its political subdivisions shall cooperate with the Office [of Historic Preservation] in order to salvage or preserve historic, prehistoric or paleoenvironmental evidence located on property owned or controlled by the United States, the State of Nevada or its political subdivisions."

To facilitate this, you may use this optional form and checklist to help gather the type of documentation the SHPO may find useful during consultation.
