The Challenge of Resource Protection



➤ NSSP monitors prehistoric and historic archaeological sites all across Nevada.

➤ We have sites right outside of urban centers and sites in very remote parts of the state.

➤ We monitor sites accessible to people with all levels of outdoor experience and mobility.



Nevada's rich and intriguing past includes more than 12,000 years of cultural history. Evidence of this history can be found at the countless archaeological sites across the state.

Every year hundreds of sites get disturbed or damaged by both human and natural causes.

Public land managers use information provided by volunteer site stewards to better preserve these sites for scientific discovery and for future generations to visit and enjoy.
