Gain 2 Artifact Points

While looking for some shade, you find a pictograph under a rock overhang. You draw what you see so you can share with others.

Fact:

Pictographs are images painted on rock.





You found a tinaja full of water.

Fact:

A Tinaja (pronounced tin - ah - ha) is a natural stone tank that holds rainwater for long periods of time.



EYES ON YOU Move One Space

You see a petroglyph of human figures on the rocks above your camp. You feel like you are being watched so you move camp.

Fact:

Petroglyphs are images pecked into rocks.





You see a prehistoric hunting camp with arrowheads all around. You explore looking for deer and have a successful hunt.

RESERVATION Gain One Artifact Point

You see gunshot damage on rocks from a recent battle between settlers and Paiutes. You look to see if anyone is still around. You are alone and move along.






You get sick at camp. A group of Paiutes stop and check on you. They give you a tea made of local plants. You get better but lose a day of travel.
