



Priorities for FY2016

The SHPO has set the following priorities for this fiscal year:

- Proposals for educational programs in conjunction with [Preservation50](#) (workshops, brochures, web-based documents, conferences, etc.) that will inform the public, developers, private property owners, and local governments on the economic value of preservation and the numerous State and Federal tax incentive programs that can be used to support economic revitalization while ensuring preservation and responsible rehabilitation.
- Encourage the creation or updating of preservation or survey plans for local governments within the state.
- Proposals for projects that will record and complete National Register of Historic Places evaluations of historic and prehistoric archaeological resources.
- Proposals for projects that will inventory historic buildings, districts, sites, and objects important in the history of underserved populations such as Basque, Chinese, Hispanic, African American and LGBT communities of Nevada.
