3. Public Comment

Public comment will be taken at the beginning and end of the meeting and may be taken at the discretion of the Chair on agenda items listed for possible action. Public comments may be limited to 3 minutes per person at the discretion of the Chair. Comment will not be restricted based on viewpoint. No action will be taken on any matters raised during the public comment period that are not already on the agenda. Persons making comment will be asked to begin by stating their name for the record.

There was no public comment.

4. Review Request from CCCHP-21-12, City of Boulder City to approve interior electrical work and to utilize funding in the current amended funding agreement for work not described in the original application and to request an extension of time. (FOR POSSIBLE ACTION).

Gary Poindexter, Public Works Director for the City of Boulder, explained the request would be to utilize funding from the current funding agreement towards interior electrical work. Mr. Poindexter noted there is currently no power to the interior of the building, so the plan would be to reuse existing electrical panels located on the exterior of the building and all existing conduit boxes, light fixtures, etc. Mr. Poindexter also explained that there are no exit signs, and he would like to do some unobtrusive lighting in the elevator shaft and basement area to allow visitors to see the historic character. Mr. Poindexter stated that this 3-month extension would allow them to put in motion detection monitored by the local police department in the case of vandalism, as has happened in the past.

Motion to approve the extension of three months and the usage of current funds for the Bolder City water filtration plant rehabilitation: Commissioner Olmstead; second by Commissioner Downs.

Motion passed unanimously.

- 5. CCCHP review and discussion to finalize grant awards. (FOR POSSIBLE ACTION).
 - a) CCCHP-23-02 Reno First United Methodist Church.

 Ron Applegate informed the Commission that they were hoping to get at least \$80,000 as the contractors are holding that bid still solid.

The pastor, George Ed Bennett, made sur ethe Commission noted that this is a capital maintenance project that would be difficult to afford, getting heating in the building.

Commission Proposed to fully fund this project at \$115,000.

- b) CCCHP-23-03 Western Missionary Museum Corporation St. Paul Church. Commission Proposed to fund the minimum for this project at \$221,468.
- c) CCHP-23-04 Reno VFW Post 9211 Veterans of Foreign War Building Kyle Jones requested an extra \$85,000 to replace the HVAC as well as the furnaces as quoted by HVAC companies that can remediate the radon by installing air purifiers

Commission Proposed to fund the minimum for this project at \$174,000.

d) CCHP-23-05 - Eureka Restoration Enterprise - Masonic Lodge Garney Damelee noted that Eureka, just like other rural areas, struggle to find contractors to come to look at issues. Ms. Damelee asked for an extra \$40,000 if the Commission would be allocating overflow funds in order to not only repair the floor beams, but also the ceiling.

Commission Proposed to fund the minimum for this project at \$194,648.

- e) CCHP-23-06 Arts for All Nevada Lake Mansion Commission Proposed to fully fund this project at \$96,925.
- f) CCHP-23-07 City of Wells El Rancho Hotel and Casino Commissioners were concerned about the application being incomplete, and therefore voted no grant.
- g) CCHP-23-08 First Presbyterian Church of Carson Commission Proposed to fully fund this project at \$117,850.
- h) CCHP-23-09 Fallon Community Theater Inc. Historic Fallon Theater Stuart Richardson asked if there was more money to allocate, they would like an extra \$29,313.97 to complete the project this year.

Commission Proposed to fund the minimum for this project at \$95,004.

i) CCHP-23-10 - Douglas County - Town of Genoa - Genoa Town Hall Commission Proposed to fund the minimum for this project at \$110,390.

- j) CCHP-23-11 Storey County Pipers Opera House Commission Proposed to fully fund this project at \$107,375.
- k) CCHP-23-12 North Central NV Historical Society Cumley Richardson House, St. Mary's Episcopal Church, and the Greinstein Building Commission Proposed to fully fund this project at \$19, 527.
- CCHP-23-13 St. Mary's Art Center Commission Proposed to fund the minimum for this project at \$189,400.
- m) CCHP-23-14 Tonopah Historic Mining Park Foundation Desert Queen Complex, Rope Shed, and Mispah Complex Service Bay

 Joe Westerland requested bringing the funding for this project from \$152,704.67 to \$165,352 as that is the amount needed to complete Building Seven, Rope House, and 52K over the Desert Queen. Joe noted this would complete one project this year, with the rope house being priority.

Commission Proposed to fund the minimum for this project at \$265,644.

- n) CCHP-23-15 Friends of Dangberg Home Ranch, Bunkhouse Commission Proposed to fully fund this project at \$75,900.
- o) CCHP-23-16 Brewery Arts Center Carson Brewing Company Commission Proposed to fund the minimum for this project at \$100,467.
- p) CCHP-23-17 Brewery Arts Center St. Teresa's Church Commission Proposed to fully fund this project at \$98,044.
- q) CCHP-23-18 Mineral County Old Esmeralda Mineral County Courthouse Commission Proposed to fully fund this project at \$44,860.
- r) CCHP-23-19 Nevada State Prison Preservation Society Nevada State Prison Chris Cox asked what would encourage the Commission to pay the full amount for repair of the second stair.

Commission Proposed to fund the minimum for this project at \$79,348.

s) CCHP-23-20 - Old Glory Theatre Co. - Cactus Theatere
Kansas from the Old Glory Theatre Co. explained to the Commission that some of the things
that they were saying were incomplete on the application were actually there on different
pages.

Commissioner Farrell asked that the missing items be provided before the funding is provided.

Commission Proposed to fully fund this project at \$9,200.

t) CCHP-23-21 - White Pine Community Choir Assoc. - Centennial Fine Arts Center Mary Eldridge spoke on behalf of the association and noted that the final numbers from the contractor were not in at the deadline of the application submittal. Ms. Eldridge explained that the \$283,000 would be to take out the ADA ramp on one level, which would allow access to the main performance hall but not the lower level, and to purchase the elevator.

Commission Proposed to fund the minimum for this project at \$305,108.

- u) CCHP-23-22 City of Ely Ely City Hall
 Commissioners were concerned about the lack of breakdown on numbers in the application and in being to track the funds. The Commission voted no grant.
- v) CCHP-23-23 Nevada Northern Railway Air Brake Building Mark Bassett asked for an additional \$46,000 to bring electricity to the building. Mr. Bassett then noted that if they could get \$23,000 they could match with other funds.

Commission Proposed to fund the minimum for this project at \$176,105.50.

w) CCHP-23-24 - Nevada Northern Railway - Kennecott Building Mark Bassett informed the Commission that this is one entity requesting grants for two different communities.

Commission Proposed to fund the minimum for this project at \$480,000.

x) CCHP-23-25 - City of Carlin - Sacred Heart Catholic Church Ella suggested that the Commission consider trying to use the extra funds to fully fund as many projects as possible due to the difficulty of finding extra funding that might result in the project getting done at all, especially in the small rural community.

Commission Proposed to fund the minimum for this project at \$2,300.

y) CCHP-23-26 - The Goldfield Historical Society - Goldfield High School. Commission Proposed to fund the minimum for this project at \$212,650.

Motion to approve the grant dollars allocated on the spread sheet and move forward with releasing these funds: Commissioner Olmstead; second by Commissioner Downs.

Motion passed unanimously.

Uh, they're similar to the existing. Also, there's no exit signs. Um, and I would like to do some unobtrusive lighting in the elevator shaft and in the basement area, which will allow vis --

So this will allow, um, them to see this area down there. Um, yeah. I've -- I've lived in that area. Yeah, I grew up in the -- the Hoover Dam homes, uh, three houses away from this building. So it's an amazing structure to me. I-I'm really excited that I'm -- I'm part of this now. Um, recently, I've been, uh, promoted to the Director of Public Work. So I am -- I'm looking at streamlining these projects. Uh, we've -we've changed a lot of what we're doing. I'm bringing in a new project manager, and so part of that is -- is requesting an

extension and also, um, being able to do this electrical work. Uh, the other part of it, um, the electrical, would allow us to put in motion detection. Um, we have had vandalism in the past, and we wanna protect this investment. Um, the -- our police department -- it would link back to the police department, um, so if there was any motion detection, they would go check on our building. Um, so yes, I'm just, uh, requesting to utilize some of the current funding and -- from, um -- from the agreement -- the original agreement, and then also, uh, three-month extension, giving me an opportunity to, uh, complete the remaining, um -- did I mute again? I see -- okay. To complete the remaining, uh, uh, scope of work and also, if approved, the electrical work.

YEANDEL: Yes, I can, I can see the screen.

CLOUD: Thank you. As you're discussing that, I'll work on the spreadsheet.

YEANDEL: Sure. Thank you. Um, so I-I believe it was -- I know there was two Commissioners -- was it --

1 Commissioner Olmstead, um, do you have comments on this? Yes. This is Commissioner Olmstead. OLMSTEAD: 2 YEANDEL: Yes. 3 And I put in \$189,000 for the City of Ely 4 OLMSTEAD: 5 because I looked at the breakdown. And there were several hundred pages, but on Page 457, there was a breakdown for the 6 basement, uh, the first floor, uh, and second floor, and then 7 the high roof. And so, the high roof was gonna be \$189,000. 8 9 And I thought that would be a beneficial, um, fund --Sure. 10 YEANDEL: 11 OLMSTEAD: -- uh, to award that amount. YEANDEL: I think that's, uh, logical. Um, so what 12 was the number again? 180 --13 \$189,000. 14 OLMSTEAD: \$189,000. And then there was another 15 YEANDEL: Commissioner that, uh, awarded no grant. 16 Rochanne Downs. And the re -- the reason 17 DOWNS: 18 that I did -- I know I have money I can lo -- can, um -- I can still allocate. Um, however it's -- going through, um, we've 19 20 asked each individual to put what the minimum was. Um, the 21 city of Ely, you know, stayed with what the original was. And 22 so to go through and -- and break it all out, um, was kind of 23 very frustrating for -- for me, especially looking at the --

the document being so -- so long and, you know, looking at how

the other, um, grantees went through and -- and broke it out

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to, you know, put it in a way that we can pick and choose what the -- what the projects are. And -- and even during the conversation, you know, I-I believe that I asked several times, you know, what it -- you know, what could make that work and I could never get a straight answer. Um, so to me it was -- it was very frustrating. And, um, to coming through to -- to issue an award, also for tracking purposes, what would that -- what would we be tracking, um -- YEANDEL: Sure.

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DOWNS: -- for -- for grant compliance as to looking at the -- the dollars. I mean, with every other proponent I went through to make sure that okay, I can, um, fund and be able to track to know what dollars were -- or -- or what portions of those, um, projects are funded. And, um, unfortunately for me, I-I-I couldn't see that with the City of Friendly -- or City of Ely, excuse me.

YEANDEL: Any other comments, uh, from the Commissioners?

UNIDENTIFIED: I believe Commissioner Timmons also gave a no award.

YEANDEL: Yeah, he gave no award. Yes. Uh, Commissioner Timmons, are you still on?

TIMMONS: Anthony Timmons for the record? I'm sorry,

I was having trouble getting in. I just finally got in. I'm

not too sure what the conversation's about.

Chair Timmons is -- we're talking about the, um, 23-22 City of Ely City Hall. Um, and I just wanted to go back since you -- you didn't award a grant, uh, on that. I just wanted to hear your reasoning on that. Uh, we -- we've -- we've just had a couple of comments about that, um -- that particular applicant and how it was difficult. It wasn't broken down sort of easily. It was very frustrating to sort of analyze the numbers. Um, and they were a little persistent on the call. So I was just wondering if you're -- if -- if you have any input or you would like to make why you -- justify why you did not want to give an award to that, uh, applicant.

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TIMMONS: Uh, Anthony Timmons for the record. Uh, yeah, this -- it's the -- the same reasons as well. And, um, essentially the -- the -- if I remember right, um, the grant also said that they could do it potentially without funds from the Commission. So that was another influence, at least from my opinion, if I remember right.

YEANDEL: Well, thank you, uh, Vice Chair Timmons.

Um, are there any other Commissioners that would like to chime in on this particular 23-22 City of, uh, Ely, Ely City Hall?

No? Um, all right. Well, I wanted to look at that one. And then I had earmarked another one. And I think I went back and, uh --

CLOUD: Mr. Chairman, the City of Wells, we also

had, um, Commissioner that wanted to ask questions about that.

And that was the one that I -- you changed that. I believe that's probably the one you're wanting to discuss.

YEANDEL: Yeah, that's the one. Yes, City of Wells. Commissioners, do you have comments about the City of Wells applicant?

UNIDENTIFIED: For me, um, you know, I'm looking at some of the items on there. That's why we came up with the \$36,449. Um, but I'm concerned about the, um, incomp -- the incomplete issues on the -- on the application. Um, and since this is my first time, I don't know how those requirements, um, are implemented in the process. Um, in other process we looked at with incomplete applications, there's no funding. I know it's -- it's, you know, the city. I understand the project. So that's why I was kind of -- I'm not really sure on some of these processes.

YEANDEL: Oh, this is Yale Yeandel for the record.

Um, yeah, I think what it is, is we -- we just, you know -- we need to find our own way here. Um, you know, it's like the original, um -- when we had our discussions at the -- at the beginning of the hearing about, um, using, uh -- building a modern building. And that's not really our mandate. And I mean, we -- we have to determine these things and the -- and the fact that it's -- it's, uh -- or a maintenance issue, you know, we have to look at these things as well. Um, uh, you

know, our -- our main purpose is to try to renovate and 1 restore and preserve. So that hand -- that -- that hand ties 2 us sometime. Um, what -- what is the -- okay, is this, uh, 23-3 07, right, City of Wells? 5 OLMSTEAD: Uh, this is Commissioner Olmstead. YEANDEL: Yes? 6 7 OLMSTEAD: Uh, can we ask Carla Cloud if the, um, staff would be able to get a complete application and, uh --8 and require that before the City of Wells could receive any 10 award? 11 YEANDEL: Yeah, I think it's a reasonable request, um. 12 Carla Cloud for the record. I'm sorry. 13 CLOUD: 14 There needs to be somebody -- if you could check your microphones and mute yourself. I'm getting a lot of feedback. 1.5 Um, and, again, Carla Cloud for the record. Yes, if, uh, that 16 is the request of the Commission, you can request the 17 18 applicant to redo the application to, um, your standards and resubmit it for Commission approval. Um, and then, uh, would 19 20 believe you would need to hold another hearing -- another 21 meeting to award that. 22 Uh, Rochanne Downs for the record. I-I DOWNS: 23 quess I-I have some concerns about that. And -- and not saying

that -- because, you know, we have an application, we have the

deadlines, and you have the requirements that are on there.

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And I think that if the rules are the same, then they need to be the same all the time. And you cannot make adjustments just because you know, it -- it's hurting our heart because, you know, for the next applicant that, you know, all of the projects are important. And I believe that we're -- we're working to -- to meet the requirements of preservation. You know, we have a lot of projects. Um, they're all equally important. We can't fund them equally. Um, but for me, I'm more of a process person. So, you know, if your application isn't complete, I'm sorry, come back in the -- the next time. And so, you know, going through this, I really struggled, um, by even awarding or -- or how this works, not knowing exactly, you know, what past practices are, because we're still guided by that too. I mean, if we fund things for not being complete, then we need to fund them all the time. Or if we're gonna, you know, fund them, um, for complete applications, then, you know, that's the criteria. They get additional money because their applications are complete. And maybe those that are complete come back next year. Um, I don't know how that works. It's my first time on here. Um, the other thing I struggled with is, um, you know, looking at the terms of restoration versus maintenance. Um, I think that that should also play an impact on how we're funding them, because I've -- you know, I heard through this process that, you know, we don't fund maintenance as much. It's more -- but I don't know what that

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means, and most of the projects that we have in here. So if we're gonna fund maintenance, then I think we need to take that caveat -- caveat off. Um, so I -- you know, just my first time coming through this process, um, I'm just -- I feel a little bit uneasy because, you know, I-I-I like to make sure the rules are -- are -- are straightforward. Everyone understands. I mean, our -- our people are -- our people applying here put a lot of time, a lot of effort, you know, really working through to get their budgets. We require a lot of -- of documentation for them. And, um -- so I think that, you know, just trying to understand this process is just a little bit confusing for me. But I don't think that it -- it would be fair to come back and say, you know, we'll fund you if you do that, because we didn't allow that for anybody else. Thank you.

YEANDEL: Uh, Vice Chair, uh, do you -- you have any input or questions or comments that might help us through this difficult process?

TIMMONS: Uh, Anthony Timmons for the record. Um, not really. Just kind of scanning through. I'm -- I'm -- I'm -- I'm -- I'm -- I'm damost leaning to kind of going with the averages. And I don't know, Carla, can we set the 72 a-aside for, because it always seems like we always get additional requests or -- or -- or there's, um, some fluctuation in dollars due to, you know, construction costs or -- or -- or overruns or that sort of thing. Can we do that and just go with the average?

CLOUD: Carla Cloud for the record. Yes, sir, if that is the, um, choosing. I also do have -- I had a couple hands raised. Sorry to, um, go there. Robin, if you'd like to unmute yourself.

REED: Uh, yes, Robin Reed for the record. Um, I believe that Commissioner Farrell is on now. So if she can weigh in on those two, you're gonna grab another \$300,000 to regrant.

CLOUD: Right. Carla Cloud for the record. Thank you very much. Commissioner Farrell, I'm sorry if you had any issues getting in. I don't know what the problem was. Um, the discussion on the -- was the, uh -- looking at CCCHP-23-07,

City of Wells and C-C-C-H-P-23-22. Um, each of the Commissioners have revised their numbers, and if you'd wish to do so, you can do that.

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So this is Commissioner Farrell. Thank FARRELL: you. Yeah, I was in a waiting room and logged out, logged back in, still in a waiting room. So thank you, Carla, for giving me directions on going a completely different way through the agenda. So my apologies fellow Commissioners. So, um -- and I'm really sorry I missed the discussion on 07. So my question, um, was really about a very incomplete application. Um, and, uh, it -- you know, at the same time, I-I know it's hard for small communities and small projects to do a sophisticated grant as some of our, um, applicants are far more experienced. But, um -- and this is really my first time going through a complete grant process. But looking at -- at that particular one, my concern is when there is a very incomplete application that, um, providing, um -- I-I don't wanna say zero, but at the same time, um -- well, it looks like the discussion was for zero. So I would be comfortable on 23-07 to revise mine to zero, um, because it's an incomplete application, not because that there isn't a real need, but I hate to reward incomplete -- substantially incomplete applications.

YEANDEL: Thank you for your input, uh,

Commissioner. Yeah. Um, I-I used the little scoring guide, um,

in our -- in our handbook. Um, and -- and this -- this one did not do well. So, um, it did not surprise me that people were 2 saying no grant on that one. Um, and then so what -- what is 3 our average to -- what is our, uh -- what is our average? What 5 -- what -- can we average out the scores of the --Yes, Carla Cloud for the re -- Carla Cloud 6 CLOUD: 7 for the record. Um, Maggie would still need to review the CCCHP-23-22 City of Ely, as you guys had the same kind of discussion, if you'd like to catch her up on that. Sure. Um, yes. Commissioner, we looked at 10 YEANDEL: the city of Ely City Hall, and, um, it did not really -- um, 11 there -- there was sort of inflex -- -hey didn't wanna break 12 out the numbers in -- in the breakout. They -- they did 13 14 provide numbers that were a-a-a smaller breakdown, but they --1.5 they -- there was no sort of minimal amount that they, um, 16 requested. And, um, you know, although it's a very good 17 project and it does break my heart to -- to not, but it --18 they didn't want to sort of comply with the rules of the -- of the application. So that's why others were like, well, I --19

know, they're -- they're not being as, um -- you know, doing the -- the work of the application. These things are hard.

They're very difficult. A lot of people put a-a lot of time into -- and I understand a smaller group, uh, you know, doesn't have that much time to do some things. You know, don't

you know, I'm not sure this should be granted because, you

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seem very, um, you know -- it -- it seems like you could break it down into phases and you could -- you could do things where you could break it down. We did get some -- some number crunching for \$189,000 to just start on the basement for that. Their total ask was \$500,000. So, um -- and they've had past awards of \$531,929. So they've gotten money from us in the past, which is good. But this just -- this particular application was not, um, sort of as -- as comprehensive as needed for tracking purposes. Does that help at all?

FARRELL: This is Commissioner Farrell. Thank you for that. And I know that we had questions in our first meeting, um, concerns that, um, the specific activities were not delineated into cost. And so, um, I think I'm similar to

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meeting, um, concerns that, um, the specific activities were not delineated into cost. And so, um, I think I'm similar to the other Commissioners that I had the request. Uh, uh, so based on that, and based on the, uh -- it was clear that they were going to generally apply a half million to a \$5 million project. Um, I concur with my fellow Commissioners and recommend zero. And hopefully they'll come back again with, uh, more detailed application in the future.

FARRELL: Thank you. That's very good sage advice.

I realize we're only talking about \$9,000, but since the application, um, was poorly done, we wanna make sure that, uh, the right information is presented before the money is finally awarded.

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um, under the direction of the Commission. It's under your review and your decision on if you would like to request the information along -- or if you want to go with how you have, um, before with incomplete applications, if they're missing any information as stated on the -- the front page of the application. It does state -- or on the checklist, that any of the items missing may not go forward to the Commission. We still forward it to the Commission as it's the Commission's decision on whether or not they want to award based on what they've received. And also --

DOWNS: Commissioner Downs, just for a quest -just -- I just wanna make a comment on, um, the

Commissioner's, um -- Maggie's just -- just her comment is

that I honestly feel that because we disqualified the other

applicants, I believe that this should be. We should hold this

to the same standard. So I would request to have, um -- for my

number to -- to remove -- to remove my \$9,200 award.

YEANDEL: I agree with Commissioner. Uh, this is Commissioner Yeandel for the record. Uh, I would zero my, uh,

award amount as well on this particular one.

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FARRELL: This is Commissioner Farrell. I recommend zero. And it breaks my heart to do it, but --

UNIDENTIFIED: Hi, uh, this is Kansas with the Old Glory. I-I just have a question regarding the black and white photo thing. I don't have a color photo of the poster stands because they're not there anymore. So, uh, the black and white photo was the only photo that was available.

DOWNS: I don't believe -- this is Rochanne Downs for the record. Um, in -- in reading this, there are like missing supplemental information, like paragraphs and stuff. It wasn't just the photo. There are additional, um -- in the application I have, I guess, there are other portions that are missing. So, um, I don't believe that -- for me it wasn't just the photo that would make it incomplete. There were other missing portions in the application.

YEANDEL: Yeah, this is Chair Yeandel for the record. Um, yeah, I would rec -- you know, I would definitely encourage Old Glory Theater to -- to reapply. Uh, but on -- on my score sheet, I had, uh, the, uh, things that were not sort of checked off where the applicant demonstrates an ability to raise or sustain required amounts of financial support from sources other than the state of Nevada, including donations of goods, services relative to the means and abilities of the applicant. I have another, um, one blank here that's the --

the project will pro produce a facility that will continue to be used as a cultural center in the future. Um, there was no sort of long-range plans or short -- short -- short term plans that were filled out, um, uh, and will be properly maintained according to the SOI standards. Um, these are just a couple of the things. I understand sometimes historical things, you're not gonna get photographs, but you can still supplement, take pictures of the entire building, the entire floor plan. You can still use your iPhone to, you know, document what is there and what needs to be fixed, even if they're not archival photographs. I just wanna encourage you to --

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UNIDENTIFIED: I have the -- sorry. I-I have the long-term plan on Page 27, and then Page 14 has the color photo over the poster stands were. I-I respect your guys' decision. I just wanted to point out that those things are in the application.

YEANDEL: Okay, fair enough. Um, you have every -so there's every elevation, every wall is documented, every
inside and -- and exterior?

UNIDENTIFIED: Uh, I don't have the entire floor plan in this application, but I have the pictures of, uh, what, uh -- the areas of the building that I'm applying for this round of the grant. So this would just be the front exterior where the poster stands are supposed to go. So the black and white photo I have is from the fifties where the

poster stands used to be. And then I have the color photos of, uh, the current front exterior that does not have the poster stands.

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YEANDEL: I see. Um, does any other Commissioners have any comments or questions? I-I-I-I really want to help you guys, but I-I-I feel like we don't have enough information to track where the money goes, you know. Um, Carla, so we're done with the, um -- we have all the averages?

CLOUD: Uh, Carla Cloud for the record. I still don't have, um, for The Glory Theater for Patricia Olmstead and for Michelle Schmitter.

YEANDEL: Okay. Commissioner Olmstead? Oh, she's -- she had to walk off.

OLMSTEAD: No, I'm here. Commissioner Olmstead is here.

YEANDEL: I'm sorry, Patricia.

OLMSTEAD: Um, I-I guess my confusion on this one is that staff did not put incomplete, uh, application in on The Old Glory Theater. So there was a reason they put it in for City of Wells, but they did not note that for The old Glory Theater. And I guess that would be a question for Carla Cloud. Uh, what was the difference between the two and -- and stating that there was missing pieces to application, but it -- it didn't say it was incomplete.

CLOUD: Carla Cloud for the record. Yes, so there

may have been, you know, small pieces here and there of missing information from each. The difference with City of Wells was that it was -- there was a series of questions that needed to be answered, and those series of questions were the biggest portion of this application, and none of those were answered. Uh, that's where that was an actual very incomplete application, where the city of -- or The old Glory Theater may have just had a few missing elements. Um, so that would be the difference of the incomplete and missing some elements.

OLMSTEAD: Thank you so much, Carla.

CLOUD: You're welcome.

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OLMSTEAD: Uh, so in hearing that, I'm afraid I would still wanna award, um, the \$9,200. Um, and of course, that doesn't -- you know, that can be removed by everyone else, uh, but I would still wanna award them.

UNIDENTIFIED: Thank you.

YEANDEL: Uh, this is Yale Yeandel, uh, Chair, for the record. Um, yeah, I agree. Um, I-I think we should look at this again. Um, \$9,200, could you put that back on my column?

Um --

UNIDENTIFIED: Thank you.

YEANDEL: I hate to go back and forth like that,
but, uh, it just seems like, um, you know, if -- if it's -- if
it's not an incomplete application -- I was under a-a
misunderstanding. And then, uh, Commissioner Downs, uh, is

still with us?

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CLOUD: Carla Cloud for the record. Uh,

Commissioner Downs, would you like to keep your number zero or

change it?

DOWNS: Just gimme a second. I'm reading all these. I'm trying to, um --

CLOUD: Of course.

DOWNS: Because when I'm looking at, you know, uh, you know, completing, answering of the questions, um, but ADA compliance is important. You can add mine back.

UNIDENTIFIED: Thank you.

CLOUD: And Commissioner Farrell?

FARRELL: Uh, this is Commissioner Farrell for the record. And thank you for this discussion. I know it's particularly tough and it probably sinks the heart of, um, staff at Old Glory Theater. Um, I would support, uh, uh, going back to the \$9,200. However, before the funds are provided, I would recommend that, um, the applicant provide the articles of incorporation that are missing, um, that the supplemental Part B paragraph about the current or intended future use of the property be submitted as well, and that the site plan is provided, um, along with, uh, photos. It — it doesn't have to be the — the photos — the past photos, but I think it would help staff to monitor the progress of the project if the missing elements are provided to, um — to staff before the

work commences, so that they are fully informed. 1 Uh, just, uh, for the record, UNIDENTIFIED: 2 articles of incorporation are Pages 33 and 34. 3 Thank you. 4 FARRELL: 5 YEANDEL: All right. Any other comments or, uh, 6 questions from the Commissioners? 7 SCHMITTER: This is Michelle Schmitter for the record. Could I change, uh, my number for CCCHP-23-03 to 8 \$221,468? 9 10 YEANDEL: Sure. 11 SCHMITTER: Thanks. 12 CLOUD: Carla Cloud for the record. I have changed that number. And Carla Cloud for the record. I, uh -- whenever 13 14 you are ready to take further comment, I do have Mary Eldridge 1.5 with the White Pine Community Choir on the line. 16 YEANDEL: Sure. The Chair -- the Chair recognizes, uh, Ms. Eldridge from the White Pine Choir. Go ahead. 17 18 ELDRIDGE: Good afternoon, Commissioners. Thank you. This is Mary Eldridge for the record. Um, I-I just would like 19 20 to advocate for the White Pine Community Choir. Um, when we 21 were requested to send in these numbers, we contacted our 22 contractor and talked with them, um, but we did not have 23 complete information when these numbers were due. And so the -- so I submitted two different numbers. The 283 has turned out 24

to be -- to take out the ramp, the ADA ramp, on one level. And

taking that out would not -- would, uh, still allow ADA access 1 to the main performance hall, but it would not, um, have the 2 ADA access on the lower level. Um, and so, um -- and then --3 but this -- the 283 still leaves in the remainder of the 5 elevator purchase, which is \$21,500. Um, so I-I just feel like I need to say that really our bare minimum is 262. Thank you 6 7 Carla Cloud for the record. Would you like CLOUD: me to change that on this spreadsheet under the minimum 8 9 request of notating \$262,000? ELDRIDGE: 10 Yes. Or would you like me to leave it? 11 CLOUD: ELDRIDGE: Well, we would prefer to have the 283, but 12 262 would be the bare minimum of what we can do to complete 13 14 the project. All right. <inaudible> --15 CLOUD: 16 ELDRIDGE: And that still leaves us raising funds to 17 supplement. Okay. Carla Cloud for the record. Just to 18 CLOUD: be clear, Chair, would you like me to change the spreadsheet 19 20 to show - reflect instead of \$283,608 to reflect 280 -- or I'm 21 sorry, 262? 22 I-I just have a question. Sorry. Rochanne DOWNS: 23 Downs for the record. Um, um, since we have additional monies allocated, do we go back and look at, you know, our minimums 24

if we wanna change them? I think it's pretty unfair if, you

know, come in and we're gonna go side by side. I mean, we have 1 to be fair and equitable here. Yes, we do have additional 2 money to allocate. Um, I guess I would like to understand a 3 little bit on the process on how we're gonna go about that. 5 Um, because maybe not all of, you know -- we don't have all of the -- the organizations on the line, and so, um, it would be 6 unfair to, you know, even though it's public comment, to make 7 -- to make changes, um, 'cause we're not providing that same 8 9 opportunity to everybody. No, agreed. Um, I, I think we should 10 YEANDEL: reevaluate the -- the numbers as -- as a whole. Um, and then 11 12 we have to make sure that number gets changed to 263. It's still 283 minimum request. 13 14 CLOUD: Carla Cloud for the record. Um, Mary 1.5 Eldridge, can you confirm, was that number 282 or 262? 16 ELDRIDGE: \$262,608. Thank you. Uh, Carla Cloud for the record, 17 CLOUD: 18 I will make that change. Rochanne Downs. Can I have clarification 19 DOWNS: 20 on that? Because I thought that I heard her say that 283,608 -21 - that is the minimum that you would need for the project, or 22 that's what you could live with? 23 262 would be the absolute minimum --262,608. That takes out the ADA ramp on the lower level of the

building, the basement of the building, and it takes out

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\$21,500 for the remainder of the purchase of the elevator. We are already matching the elevator purchase with \$30,000, and we believe we could raise the \$21,500.

DOWNS: So clarification then for the compliance. So you're -- you would not be able to per -- with the 283 you would not be able to -- tell me again what the ADA, um, shortfall would be again, with the change -- with the \$20,000 change here.

ELDRIDGE: It would allow access to the main performance hall of the building. It would not allow access to the basement. There is currently no ADA access in this building. So this project would allow the ADA access to the main floor.

DOWNS: Thank you.

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ELDRIDGE: Thank you.

YEANDEL: So this is, uh, Commissioner, um, Yale
Yeandel. I was gonna mention to the other Commissioners, since
we're looking at this particular pine -- White Pine, uh, Choir
Association, uh, are any Commissioners interested in
reshuffling their numbers? Uh, I want to keep mine at
\$283,608, but, uh, if anyone wants to change their numbers
since we're looking at that particular application.

maintenance. Um, and when I was in the corporate world, we had

a difference between operational maintenance and capital

maintenance. And -- and capital maintenance was something that

you couldn't afford in your operational budget. And so I am

hoping that the Commissioners can consider that this is a

capital maintenance project that's really difficult for us to

afford in this particular situation. And that, um -- and that

now that the funds have been a little bit liberated, that some

Commissioners might be able to increase their, um, allocation

because it really is a hardship for us to get to the heating of this building, but it's something that's absolutely necessary. And so your, um, additional consideration would be greatly appreciated.

YEANDEL: Thank you, sir. I appreciate your comments. Um, we'll take it into consideration. Um, all right. So is there any other public comments, uh, from any other people, Carla?

CLOUD: Yes, sir. I have, uh, Kyle Jones, and then Garney Damele, and I also have Christopher Cox on the line.

They're coming in. So, uh,

YEANDEL: All right.

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CLOUD: Kyle Jones?

YEANDEL: Let's hear Kyle Jones, please.

JONES: Hello, Commission. For the record, my name is Kyle Jones of the Reno Veterans of Foreign War Building. Uh, just for clarification, I'd like to know, are we opening up for public discussion on the excess of funds and allocation of those funds? I don't wanna waste any more time. You guys have spent enough trying to figure all this out. And if you guys are gonna deliberate, uh, on this in a later meeting, or if we're gonna keep it -- or if you're gonna keep it as, uh, overflow or -- or something, then I don't wanna waste your time asking for more.

YEANDEL: No, I appreciate that, sir. Uh, and thank

you again for your service. Um, we definitely have to, um, go over -- this is very, very tough issues. Um, but, uh, I appreciate your appeal and, uh, we -- we -- we want to hear from -- from others in the public too. So, uh, thank you, sir. Appreciate your input.

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JONES: Absolutely. If the floor does open up for us to request, uh, that different phases be funded, then I would like a chance. Thank you.

YEANDEL: Thank you. Uh, next up, Carla, for public comment? Carla, I think you're muted.

CLOUD: Sorry about that. Carla Cloud for the record. Yes, Garney, uh, Damele, we have on the line with Eureka. Go ahead, Garney. You'll have to unmute yourself.

DAMELEE: Good afternoon. This is Garney Damele with Eureka Restoration for the record. I just wanted to throw my 2 cents in too, if you're going to discuss reallocating funds. Um, my new request was \$307,000, and then I -- my minimum was the 174. The, um -- I guess the point I'm trying to make too is, um, in Eureka, along with probably other rural areas, but I had a very difficult time trying to find a contractor to come out and take a look at the issue. Um, I think the only reason they -- Raymond Brothers came out, they're from more Reno, is because I had worked with them before in a prior CCCHP project. So I think they -- they came out because of that. And my only concern if I don't get mo -- as much as I

can from them, I don't know that I can get another contractor to come out and -- and, um, work on my issue. So that -- I did break everything into phases. And I am on Phase 3, which is the -- the beams, and that's what I mostly talked about the last time. But the other part is the back room. They --Raymond Brothers was also going to repair the ceiling. It's just as bad as the floor beams. And that's for this phase specifically, which is the back room that I'm working on. So I would -- I mean, if you're reallocating, I wanted 307, but another \$40,000 would help me with that back room, um, a lot more than the 174. So that was -- I just wanted to put my 2 cents in on getting this contractor here. I've worked really hard at finding somebody to look at the -- the issue. I probably contacted six contractors. This is the only person that would come. That's it. Thank you. YEANDEL: Thank you very much for your input. Appreciate -- any other public comments? Carla Cloud for the record. I have CLOUD: Christopher Cox on the line with the Nevada State Prison Preservation Society.

21 YEANDEL: Sure.

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CLOUD: Go ahead.

YEANDEL: Chair recognizes.

COX: Thank you, Carla. Um, this is Chris Cox for the record. Um, I'm sure you've seen this coming. Uh, thank you

guys very much because it seems most of you are willing to, uh, trust us -- trust us with the \$80,000 for the repair of that second stair. And I'd like to ask all of you, uh, what I might be able to say to it to, uh, encourage you to pay for the full amount. Uh, and what would you like, uh, to see us, uh, be willing to demonstrate about how we can, uh, use those funds in a responsible and timely manner? Um, that's a tough question. We're --YEANDEL: we're sort of weighing many good projects at the same time. So it's -- it's -- it's difficult to say that you're negligent in one area and -- and flush in another. Um, we will, uh -- we'll look at the numbers and, um, we -- we didn't really wanna bring up, uh, sort of start reallocating monies right now. Um, let me get back to the Commissioners and we'll look at some averages and see if we can possibly squeeze some more money for you. But I-I-I don't know. We're, you know -- we wanna -we wanna be fair to everybody and that's -- that's the hard part. All right. Thank you very much. COX: Thank you. YEANDEL: CLOUD: Carla Cloud for the record. I have no further public comment or raising hands at the --YEANDEL: I think you -- you cut out on us, Carla. You're -- you're unmuted -- you're muted.

record. I do not have any other hands raised at the moment.

And if you see on the average column, we are at still needing to allocate \$334,772.53.

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UNIDENTIFIED: I think that everybody should re-look at their numbers and -- and possibly add to -- or we look at the average numbers and see where we could possibly help these, um, entities more.

YEANDEL: I agree. I agree. We need more, uh, time to consider this. And I don't know --

UNIDENTIFIED: Mr. Chairman, can -- can we take a break for like 15 minutes just as Commissioners that we can look at our numbers a little bit?

The last one would be the minimum of \$156,903. And there's a note in the chat. Sorry, I admit -- I think I have a incorrect number. 23-13, uh, should be \$189,400. Thank you.

CLOUD: Carla Cloud for the record. Thank you very much. Uh, that brings our average remaining amount at 278,222. But if you look under every Commissioner's, um -- Patricia's leaves, uh, left to allocate of \$55,139. So, um, when you come to a final number that you would like, I will enter it in this final award column, and we can play with the numbers from there. So you can let me know what you would like entered there if you have discussion.

CLOUD: Carla Cloud for the record. For CCCHP-23-21, um, you were looking to keep it at your original. So let me put these numbers into the final column and you can tell me how you would like me to adjust them. Um, I will go according to what Patricia Olmstead has just read off here, and then you guys, uh, can tell me how to adjust as necessary.

YEANDEL: Perfect.

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CLOUD: Okay. What do I have off here?

YEANDEL: I believe you entered zero. Uh, shouldn't that just be a dash? Yeah, there you go.

CLOUD: Yeah, I'm -- I'm good now. There we go.

So, um, Carla Cloud for the record, uh, the total now of final, um -- in the final award column is \$2,794,861 with a remaining of \$55,139 to allocate, um, still to some of these applications. Um, please -- uh, Carla Cloud for the record.

Joe Westland, if you are able to unmute yourself, please go ahead. I'm not getting Joe. Oh, Joe, I'm gonna unmute -- take your hand down. It looks like I-I didn't do that before. My apologies. Maggie Farrell has her hand raised.

YEANDEL: Chair recognizes Maggie Farrell.

FARRELL: Uh, this is Commissioner Farrell. So thank you. That's a huge help. I, um, agree with everything except for 23-17. This is St. Teresa's Church Safety. Um, and the

reason why is because of Brewery Arts Center. I realize there 1 are two different buildings, application number 16 and 2 application number 17, um, but it is one complex. Um, and so 3 my recommendation, uh, would be to stick with the \$26,830. Um, 5 and if I was going to increase an application, um, looking at application 23-25, City of Carlin Sacred Heart Catholic 6 Church, they reduced their minimum all the way down to \$2,300, 7 um, by taking the windows out. And my recommendation would be 8 9 for the original request of \$46,310.97. Get those windows in. Commissioner Farrell, I-I thought when we 10 OLMSTEAD: talked to the city of Carlin, um, she said they could not take 11

YEANDEL: Yeah.

care of the windows.

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OLMSTEAD: And so those were my notes on that. And so they wouldn't actually be able to use the money at this point, that she would come back again in another round when they were fully prepared after the, um, mold testing was done.

UNIDENTIFIED: I remember that also, just that the money would be to help with the -- with the testings to come back with, um, another --

YEANDEL: That's why it's such a low amount is because that's -- the testing is \$2,600 for mold and lead and asbestos.

FARRELL: Okay.

YEANDEL: That we -- they --

FARRELL: T --1 Yeah, we had problems with that. YEANDEL: 2 Okay. This is Commissioner Farrell. Thank 3 FARRELL: you for that. I did not write that down and my notes from last 4 5 time, so thank you. So I'll stick with the \$2,300 then. UNIDENTIFIED: Teamwork makes --6 7 YEANDEL: Those are good numbers. I think those are good numbers. Uh, I-I would like to switch mine to those --8 9 those numbers as well. Okay. Uh, Carla Cloud for the record. And 10 CLOUD: 11 let me get confirmation. So we would like to update, excuse me, the Brewery Arts Center 23-17. Um, Commissioner Farrell, 12 13 you wanted to change that number to -- or keep it at \$26,830 14 for you. So would you -- that's what you guys would like me to 1.5 put under the final is \$26,830, or leave it as is. Yes, I-I would prefer that. 16 UNIDENTIFIED: Yes, I would as well. 17 YEANDEL: 18 CLOUD: Thank you. And we are keeping the \$2,300 for, uh, City of Carlin, 23-25. Is that correct? 19 20 City of Carlin, 23-25 --21 CLOUD: It's one for \$2,300. Yes, that's correct. 22 OLMSTEAD: 23 CLOUD: Thank you. So now our, um, average has increased to allocate back up to \$126,353. I also have Mike 24

Bernie on the line, and Kyle Jones would also like to speak.

And I have -- since, uh, John Eckman has not been able to get his microphone unmuted, I do have an email from him. Um, John, if there's anything further you want to express, please let me know and I will read it off to the Commission. But I'm happy to read his email to you and also allow these others to speak when you're ready.

YEANDEL: Yes. Let's, uh -- let's start with the -- the first public comment please.

CLOUD: Okay. Um, Mike Bernie, go ahead and unmute yourself please.

RICHARDSON: Well, Mike Bernie is not here today, but Stuart Richardson is.

CLOUD: Okay.

RICHARDSON: Mike is on vacation, so I'm sitting in for him. Um, I was just going to put a pitch in. Uh, we had -- we had three different phases to our project, and we dropped the big one that was the restructuring for the earthquake in the -- in the building. Um, the \$95,000 that's currently there is gonna cover the -- the air conditioning and heating and -- which is gonna complete the process in the building. And the one other little small, I think we had -- I don't have my grant right in front of me, but I think it was \$26,000 something to -- to redo the door on the stage, which -- which was the original way that people used to come in and bring the performers and all the supplies for the vaudeville

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YEANDEL: Yeah, let's hear, uh, from the next public comment, please.

CLOUD: All right. Kyle Jones, go ahead and unmute yourself please.

JONES: For the record this is Kyle Jones with the, uh, Reno Veterans of Foreign Wars Building. I just wanted to make it known, I appreciate everything that you guys are doing and understand the difficulty of your decisions. But I also would be remiss if I didn't put in my comment to request an extra \$85,000 to take care of replacing the HVAC as well as the furnaces. Currently we're working on three dilapidated swamp coolers, and because the building is two thirds underground, we also have a problem with rate on, we've had quotes from HVAC companies that can remediate the radon on by

installing air, uh, purifiers. And the quote's part of a Phase 1 2 project that I've proposed. Uh, it's well within our means 2 to be able to take care of this in the allotted time since 3 we've opened the forum up to requesting increases. 5 YEANDEL: All right. Thank you. Appreciate your 6 comments. Next public comment? 7 Okay. Mark Bassett, go ahead and unmute CLOUD: 8 yourself. 9 BASSETT: Good afternoon, Commissioners. This is Mark Bassett with Nevada Northern Railway, and of course, 10 we're always scrambling for money. And I appreciate everything 11 you've given us on the air brake building, but if we could get 12 another \$46,000 that would bring electricity to the building, 13 14 which would be a giant help. I-I think the best way to explain this is, it might not be a fair comparison in that the Commission will be awarding grants, multiple grants to -- like in Reno and other communities. Whereas in this particular case -- in these other communities, you have different organizations that have come forward and do wonderful presentation -- uh, preservation projects. In this particular case, because we're so small, so remote, it's -and the McGill complex is 12 miles away from our main complex. It -- it's almost -- if you could think of it as this is a request to do economic development in McGill versus economic development here in Ely. And, you know, we will be doing, uh -- we will spend every dollar we get to the nth degree and stretch it as far as possible. But -- and putting electricity into that building will make that building usable, uh, more quickly than, uh, we would do it. But I would just ask the Commissioners to consider, instead of multiple agencies requesting grants for one community, we have the inverse here where we do have one entity requesting grants for two different communities. Thank you, Commissioners.

Sure. Any other public comment? CLOUD: Carla Cloud for the record. I have an email from John Eckman again. And John states that he was just wondering if it's the intent of the Commission to reduce their initial, initial individual award amount from approximately \$232,000 to \$157,000. That lesser amount would require the society to contribute a \$75,000 match to arrive to complete the \$232,000 project. Uh, he doesn't really feel that this was the intent of the Commission when they first submitted their numbers for each project. Thank you.

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FARRELL: This is Commissioner Farrell. I'm sorry to keep asking this, but what project is that referring to? We have 27 projects that we're tracking and lots of numbers, so it'd be helpful. Thank you, sorry.

CLOUD: Of course. Carla Cloud for the record.

That would be CCCHP23-26, the Goldfield Historical Society.

UNIDENTIFIED: Thank you. Um, I would feel comfortable with the average that we had, um, from our first numbers, just because it is a large project and, um, that -- that, um, was actually re -- or the total was reduced instead of increased.

YEANDEL: This is Chair Yeandel for the record.

Yeah, I agree too. I mean, there's really no fair way to do

this. You know, different communities, several projects in one

community, different organizations, you know, there's -
there's apples and oranges here. So I think, you know, the

best -- the fairest way is to just to do, uh, an average and

try to, you know -- I think we've -- we've focused on the

dollar amounts enough, but I-I would suggest to the other Commissioners that we vote on an average. And -- and well.

DOWNS: Uh --

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YEANDEL: Yeah, go ahead.

DOWNS: Mr. Chairman. I-I, um -- I-I-I feel comfortable still with the Railroad Found -- Railway

Foundation as we have them. Um, I understand, um, the comment in -- in different, um, organizations. However, you know, they are still under the same umbrella. Um, and, you know, we can work on -- on that. But, you know, as for funding wise, I-I-I feel comfortable with the two that we have for the Railroad

Foundation. But mine was for the Goldfield Historical Society where our numbers were a little bit higher, but when we looked at, um, the minimum which we placed for that one was actually lower than we had averaged from the beginning. So I believe that our budget still allows for us to, um, go back to what our original average was for that line item.

OLMSTEAD: Uh, this is Commissioner Olmstead.

YEANDEL: Yes, Commissioner Olmstead?

OLMSTEAD: The only reason I had the \$156,903 is because that was the minimum that they requested, um, when we asked for that. So I'm good if we put them back up to the average that we had earlier at \$212,650.

YEANDEL: Uh, I am in agreement with that. We can put 'em back to the \$212,660.

CLOUD: Thank you. Carla Cloud for the record. 1 That leaves us with a remaining \$40,000. If you would like to 2 take any consideration to the public comments that were just 3 4 given by applicants. 5 YEANDEL: Yes. Uh, let's hear some more public 6 comments. 7 Uh, let's see if I have more. I don't have CLOUD: any further raised. Just making -- sorry, Carla Cloud for the record. I don't have any other public comments or hands raised at this time. Um, but we have, uh, that amount of money 10 remaining if you want to consider what you just heard from 11 other applicants is what I was saying. 12 13 YEANDEL: Um, sure. 14 DOWNS: I-I missed -- I missed the amount from the 1.5 VFW regarding the heating and what the final number was. Was that within the minimum or -- and what was the difference on 16 that, number wise? 17 This is Commissioner Olmstead. They asked 18 OLMSTEAD: for 85,000 more. 19 20 Also a question just, um -- and from past DOWNS: 21 years, you know, looking back, do we need to save a 22 contingency for those other unforeseen, um, issues that we 23 have with our grantees? So I mean, with that \$40,000, that

might be, um the --

OLMSTEAD:

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Commissioner -- Commissioner Olmstead, and

I've gone through two of these and we have always given out 1 every single dollar. Um, randomly some of the grantees cannot 2 fulfill, uh, what they had in their projects, and we will get 3 money back, and that is why we sometimes have additional 5 monies, um, after the grantees are done. And Carla Cloud for the record. Our bond 6 CLOUD: 7 funds will also earn interest every quarter. We have four quarters in the fiscal year that this bond will earn interest. Uh, and that can be a pretty substantial amount when we have that much money sitting in the bond. So, um, there will be 10 interest that comes later that could be used as those 11 additional funds to award at another time. Carla Cloud for the 12 record. We have Mark Bassett with his hand raised. 13 14 YEANDEL: Mark Bassett? Sure. Chair recognizes Mark 1.5 Bassett. 16 BASSETT: Thank you, Mr. Chairman. Uh, what I'd be willing to do on that electricity, it's budgeted at \$46,000. 17 18 If I could get \$23,000, I would match that \$23,000 with other funds, and then we get that much further on that building. 19 20 Thank you, Ms. -- thank you, Mr. Chairman. 21 And what application is that one again? So, um, I was just looking to see if there is a possibility of increasing that a bit more. Or the 19 20 <crosstalk>, When I -- when I looked at our -- the 21 DOWNS: 22 numbers -- Rochanne Downs for the record. I -- when I had gone 23 through and we redid 'em, I-I had increased both of them because I know they have -- those are large projects. So maybe 24

it's possible that we, you know, split the difference of the

remaining that we have at \$20,000 -- add \$20,000 to each of them. Um, because they're still not gonna meet -- you know, it's not gonna complete it, but, you know, it's not gonna be that \$80,000 or, um, but listening to, um, the Commissioners and -- and all of them looking at -- we can't fund the full thing, but that might be a difference to use the rest of those remaining funds.

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FARRELL: Great idea. This is Commissioner Farrell. Thank you, Commissioner Downs.

YEANDEL: I do -- I do have a-a comment about the railroad, um, that, uh, using public monies for the request, additional, uh, \$23,000 for McGill. It's not in Ely. It's in McGill. Um, and all those -- all those buildings were donated to that organization. So I don't feel that it's the same, uh, you know -- getting monies for the same operation in the same community. So, uh, that would be my sort of suggestion would be -- and since he's willing to, um, well -- very small, but, uh, anyway, that's my --

CLOUD: I'm sorry, Carla -- Carla Cloud for the record. I'm sorry, sir. That last little bit of sentence, um, broke up. I don't -- didn't catch anything you said.

YEANDEL: I was just saying that, uh, I believe that the 20 -- \$23,000 for the railway, um, uh, in McGill I think is interesting. Uh, and that would be my suggestion to beef that number up with \$23,000.

FARRELL: This is Commissioner Farrell. I totally agree. This is, um, difficult to make decisions on really good projects, and we know that individuals need the funding. It's just not enough funding to do everything that everybody wants. And I appreciate all the applications, um, the time

individuals have given, not only in the application process, 1 but attending the hearings. 2 Carla Cloud for the record. I have Grace 3 CLOUD: Spiker on the line with the, uh, first Presbyterian Church of 5 Carson City. Yes, uh, let's get public comment from 6 YEANDEL: 7 Grace. Grace, the Chair recognizes you. This is Grace Spiker for the record. Thank 8 SPIKER: you very much for your time and effort. I know it's very painful, time consuming, but I feel that you've done an 10 equitable job of distributing the funds. We appreciate it and 11 12 thank you very much. And please feel free to apply again. All -13 YEANDEL: 14 - all, uh, applicants, were were good causes and, uh, you 15 know, we wanna restore Nevada. Really appreciate YEANDEL: your time and efforts. I would, uh, like to adjourn the meeting if that's okay with everyone. Uh, Carla Cloud for the record. I would 10 CLOUD: just take public comment one last time as listed on the 11 agenda, um. 12 Sure.
