

Upon your invitation on behalf of the Winnemucca Historical Resources Commission (HRC), Kautz Environmental Consultants, Inc. (KEC) has prepared a cost estimate to complete a National Register of Historic Places (NRHP) nomination for the Bridge Street Historic District in Winnemucca, Nevada.

In order to prepare the historic district nomination, KEC proposes the following Scope of Work (SOW):

**Task 1: Attend project kick-off meeting.** Ms. Campana will attend a kick-off meeting with the City of Winnemucca and a designee from the Nevada State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO).

Task 2: Conduct primary and secondary source research at relevant archives. Ms. Campana will conduct research pertaining to the history and development of the historic Bridge Street commercial corridor. Archival repositories will include the University of Nevada, Reno; the Humboldt Museum; and the Nevada Historical Society. Secondary sources, including prior studies, inventories and surveys, oral histories, and other relevant literature, will also be consulted as part of the research process. Historical newspapers will be another key source of information, as will previous surveys and studies of the area.

**Task 3: Complete inventory and photo-documentation of the district.** Using a high-resolution digital camera, Ms. Campana will complete color photo-documentation of the proposed historic district. This task will include field inventory of all resources within the district to determine whether they contribute to the overall historic district. Contributing status will be recorded on a spreadsheet. Photography will adhere to the National Park Service's (NPS) Photo Policy. Photographs will thoroughly document the district and its representative resources. Photographs will be labeled according to NPS guidelines and keyed to a map or site plan.

**Task 4: Draft National Register nomination for the Bridge Street District.** Ms. Campana will synthesize the information collected during Tasks 2 and 3 to draft an NRHP nomination for the district. Nomination forms will follow all instructions provided therein and include a detailed narrative description, statement of significance, photo-documentation, and relevant maps.

**Task 5: Revise and finalize National Register nomination.** Ms. Campana will incorporate all requested revisions from the City of Winnemucca Historic Resources Commission and Nevada SHPO into the final NRHP nomination forms.

**Task 6: Attend a public meeting for property owners**. Ms. Campana will travel to Winnemucca to attend a public meeting for property owners within the district to present the nomination, explain the NRHP designation process, and answer questions.

It is estimated that the nomination will cost **\$19,746**. This will include two instances of travel to Winnemucca: the first to conduct research and photo-documentation of the district, and the second to attend a public meeting. To save on travel costs, the City of Winnemucca may choose to schedule the public meeting while Ms. Campana is in Winnemucca for the research and inventory portion of the nomination process. This estimate includes digital copies and submissions of the nomination. Upon the client's request, KEC will provide hard copies at a cost of \$0.50 per page plus postage.

This proposal assumes that the City of Winnemucca will conduct all notification activities for property owners within the district.

All aspects of this project will be performed by, or directly supervised by, ZoAnn Campana, M.P.S. Ms. Campana received a Master's degree in Preservation Studies from the Tulane University School of Architecture and meets the Secretary of the Interior's Professional Qualification Standards as an Architectural Historian and Historian.

As KEC's principal architectural historian, Ms. Campana is involved with the documentation, evaluation, and preservation of historic architectural resources. She is familiar with both high-style and vernacular architecture, as well as residential and commercial property types, throughout Nevada. She has completed a number of successful NRHP nominations for both historic districts and individual properties. Ms. Campana works cooperatively with other professional staff at KEC, including archaeologists, historians, full-time GIS staff, and graphic artists.

historic commercial corridor, wherein the earliest occupants of Winnemucca conducted business. The area of focus is generally described as Bridge Street, from Second Street to Railroad Street, namely within blocks W, X, T, S, Q, R, N, M, C, B/J, and I. A few select additional properties fronting Melarkey Street and Railroad Street are also included due to their historic integrity and continuity to other contributing properties within the aforementioned mentioned blocks. The area encompasses 65 parcels (consisting of 91 lots) of which 8 parcels are parking lots and 57 contain structures. Of those structures, early assessments have determined 18 to be non-contributing, while 39 are considered potentially contributing. (See attached spreadsheet and parcel maps.)

To assist with the nomination process, Winnemucca Historic Resources Commission will be working with a consultant, ZoAnn Campana, M.P.S., an architectural historian with Kautz Environmental Consultants. Ms. Campana has identified six tasks to complete in her proposed scope of work for this project:

- 1- Project kick-off meeting with the City and SHPO
- 2- <u>Primary and secondary research on history and development of the historic</u> <u>Bridge Street commercial corridor. (*includes travel to Winnemucca*)</u>
- 3- Inventory and full photo-documentation of the proposed district
- 4- Draft of a national register nomination for the Bridge Street Historic District
- 5- Revise and finalize the register nomination
- 6- <u>Attend a public meeting for property owners to present the nomination,</u> <u>explain the process and answer questions (*includes travel to Winnemucca*)</u>
